Lesson	Word	Definition
17	abdicate (abdicated)	(1) to give up a high position, or refuse responsibility for something
17	abolished	(1) to officially end a law, system, etc.
17	absolute	(1) complete or total; definite, not likely to change
17	abstract	(1) existing as a general idea, based on general ideas; not concrete
18	advocate	(1) <i>v.</i> to strongly support a particular idea or way of doing things (2) <i>n.</i> someone who strongly supports an idea or particular way of doing things
18	delegate	(1) <i>n.</i> someone chosen to speak, vote, or make decisions for a group (2) <i>v.</i> to give part of your responsibility or work to another
18	designate	(1) to choose someone or something for a particular job or purpose
14	emigrate	(1) to leave your own country in order to live in another
18	estimate	(1) <i>v.</i> to judge the value, size, etc., of something (2) <i>n.</i> a calculation or judgment about size, value, cost, etc., of something
14	export (exported)	(1) to send or sell goods to another country, or the products sold
17	extracurricular	(1) activities done for fun that are not part of usual schoolwork
14	immigrate	(1) to enter another country in order to live there
14	import (imported)	(1) to bring something into a country from another country
16	intercept	(1) to stop someone or catch something that is going from one place to another
16	intermediate	(1) done or happening between two other stages, levels, etc.
15	obligation	(1) a moral or legal duty to do something
16	proceeds	(1) the money gained from doing or selling something
16	prosperity	(1) the condition of having money and being successful
18	simulate	(1) to make or do something that is not real but looks, sounds, or feels as though it is real
17	subdued	(1) someone or something that is unusually quiet, or less bright or less active than usual
17	subject (subjected)	(1) likely to be affected by something, or dependent on something (2) to force someone to do or experience something unpleasant
17	subordinate	(1) less important than something else; lower in rank or authority
17	transaction	(1) a business deal; an exchange between two or more people or groups
17	transient	(1) continuing or existing for only a short period of time (2) passing quickly through a place, or staying only a short time (3) someone who has no home or job and moves from place to place, often asking people for money
